

Dwyer Newsletter September 2024

September 10th will mark the 211th anniversary of one of the most famous Naval Battles in American History: The Battle of Lake Erie during The War of 1812. Since the beginning of the war, Lake Erie was under British control along with the American frontier fort of Fort Detroit. The British hoped to parlay this advantage to a future invasion of the American West via Ohio or Pennsylvania. Needless to say, we needed a decisive victory to preserve the western flank of the union from the probable invasion. In March 1813 Commodore (then Master Commandant) Oliver Hazard Perry was named Chief Naval Officer for the building of a fleet for Lake Erie at Presque Isle Bay in Erie, Pennsylvania; the very popular sandbar that thousands of vacationers go to every summer kept our fleet from being destroyed. Commodore Perry placed American cannons on the sandbar, offering protection from British plans to destroy the developing fleet of ships being built there. Once the ships were ready, they sailed along the coastline to Put-In-Bay, Ohio to begin the battle process.

On September 10th, the Commodore's squadron spotted the British, pulled up anchor and left Put-In-Bay to commence the battle. Although the British had longer ranged cannon's, the overall supremacy of fire power belonged to us. Commodore Perry thus ordered the *USS Niagara* and *USS Lawrence* (his own ship) to move close to the British ships due to this lack of firing range. Here flew the famous flag to inspire his men, the one that says "DON'T GIVE UP THE SHIP". The Commodore had this flag made to honor his friend, James Lawrence, commander of the frigate *Chesapeake*, who uttered these words as he lay dying while trying to break the British blockade of Boston.

The commander of the *USS Niagara* froze under the withering fire so the *USS Lawrence* faced two British ships alone, and Commodore Perry stayed in command of his ship until the last cannon became inoperable, at which point he led his men on a row boat to the *Niagara* where he took command and raised his flag. The British thought he did this to lead his men to a retreat, but they must have forgotten that they were dealing with Americans, and not French or Spanish foes. A favorably wind started blowing, enabling us to easily move into proper positioning; at this point we utterly decimated the British flotilla. Aftermath: British naval commander, Admiral Barclay, having recognized that his lines were broken and morale was shot, surrendered and gave up the ship, his two largest to be exact: The *HMS Detroit* and *HMS Queen Charlotte*. The British abandoned Fort Detroit and we gained supremacy of Lake Erie which we held for the rest of the war and the threat of a British invasion through either Ohio or Pennsylvania was no more. This was done at the cost of 123 American casualties (27 killed, 96 wounded, 0 taken) and 440 British causalities (41 killed, 93 wounded, 306 missing and captured).

Many towns, counties, streets and schools have been named in honor of Commodore Perry, including our very own Perry, which was split off from the Town of Leicester and formally incorporated as the Town of Perry in 1814 (the village was formed and named in 1830).
